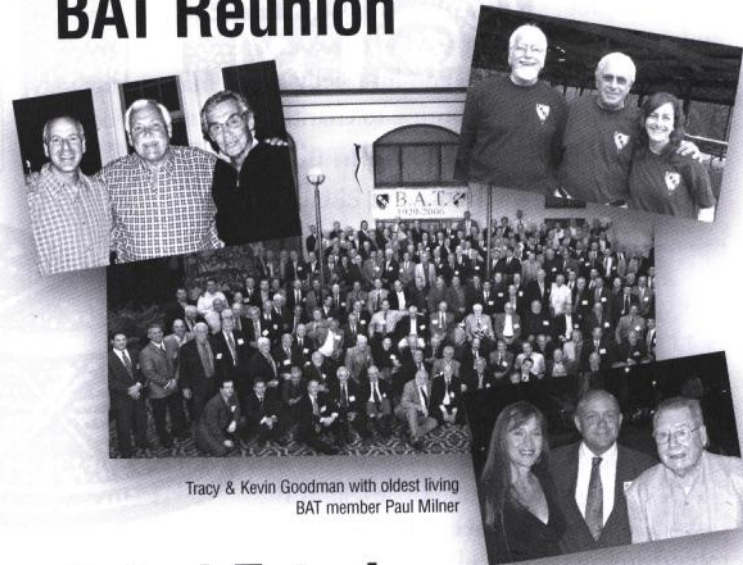

Sales have grown from \$75,000 in the first year to over \$600,000 in the second with growth continuing.
